

## The Positive Outcomes of Fearing Allah

1. Fear makes you do good deeds	“(Are they better) or those who worship devoutly in the hours of the night, prostrating and standing, <b>fearing</b> the Hereafter and hoping for the mercy of their Lord?” (39:9).	
2.	“But you [O Prophet] <b>can only warn those who fear</b> their Lord, though they cannot see Him...” (35:18).	
3.	In a ḥadīth qudsī, Allah says, “By My glory, I will not combine two fears nor two assurances for My slave: if he <b>feared</b> Me in the world, I will grant him safety on the Day of Judgement. And if he felt safe from Me in the world, I will make him fear Me on the Day of Judgement” (Ibn Ḥibbān).	–
4.	Amongst the seven categories of people who will be granted shade on the Day of Judgement, one will be “a man who was invited to (commit zinā) by a noble, wealthy woman, but he said, <b>‘I fear Allah’</b> ” and another will be “a man who remembered Allah whilst he was alone and he cried” (Bukhārī).	–
5.	The Messenger of Allah ﷺ said, “A man who wept out of the <b>fear of Allah</b> shall not enter the Fire until the milk returns to the udder [i.e. an impossibility]” (Tirmidhī).	–
6.	“And as for those who <b>feared standing before their Lord</b> and restrained themselves from (evil) desires, Paradise will certainly be (their) home” (79:40-1).	
7.	“Allah is pleased with them and they are pleased with Him. This is (only) for those in <b>awe</b> of their Lord” (98:8)
