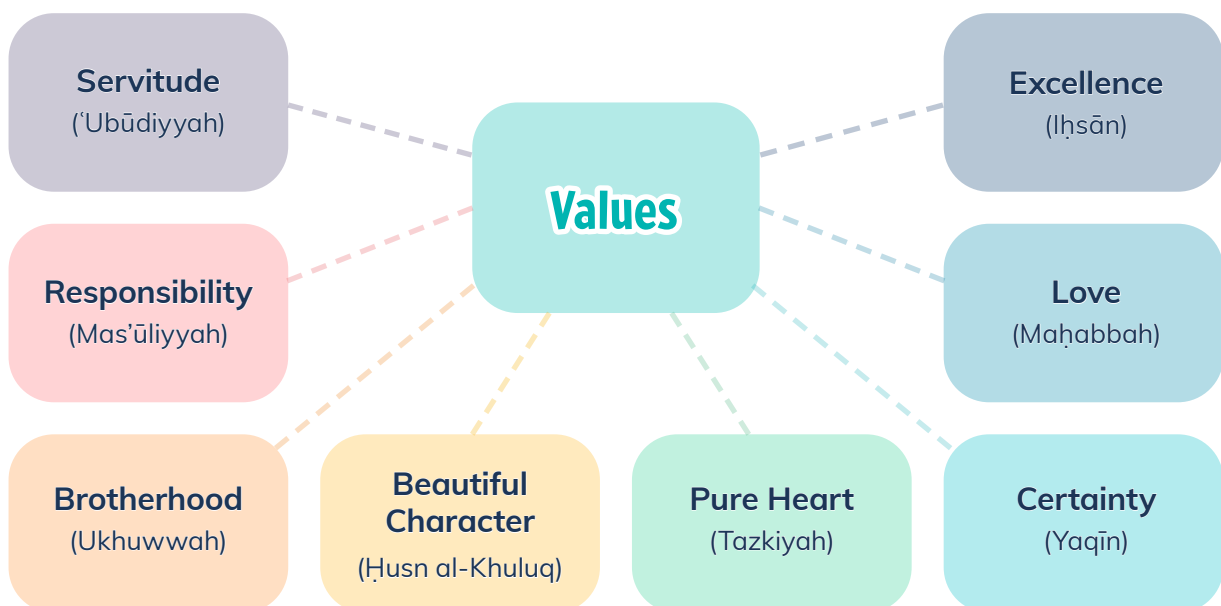

Introduction



All praise and thanks are for Allah, the Lord of the worlds, the Ultimate Guide. May peace and blessings be upon His beloved Prophet, Muhammad ﷺ, who He sent as the best teacher and guide.

Alḥamdulillāh, we are pleased to share with you the 1st edition of the 'Akhlaq and Adab Activity Book'. This book is the second in the Activity Book series, following the 'Iman Activity Book'.

Our primary aim is to instil akhlāq (good manners) and the love of Allah ﷻ and His Messenger ﷺ in young hearts. This book consists of 30 engaging lessons, encompassing various daily interactions and scenarios that children may encounter.

This book contains 40+ pages of activities to consolidate key concepts and introduce basic reading, writing, math, and fine motor skills. The activities aim to nurture spiritual intelligence and good character.

This book has been prepared to be used as a textbook in a 'limited resource' classroom setting. Teachers are encouraged to incorporate stories, nasheeds, and if logistically possible, craft and physical activities into each lesson. To nurture imān in the hearts of young learners, engage the minds of your students by holding discussions, asking questions and using examples that they can relate to.

This book may also be used in a home setting. Although every child is different, the average target age of this book is 5 and above. Whilst older children may learn from and use this book independently, younger children may require assistance from an adult.

In order to nurture Prophetic akhlāq in our children, we have to embody these akhlāq ourselves, especially when we are teaching. Mu'āwiyah b. al-Ḥakam رضي الله عنه said about the Prophet ﷺ "...May my father and mother be ransomed for him! I have not seen a teacher before him nor after him who was better than him in teaching. By Allah, he did not scold me, nor did he hit me or insult me..." (Bukhārī).

We look forward to hearing your feedback and suggested changes which can be incorporated in the next edition inshāAllāh.

We pray our young learners grow to exemplify Prophetic character in all aspects of their lives, and enrich their communities and the entire world.

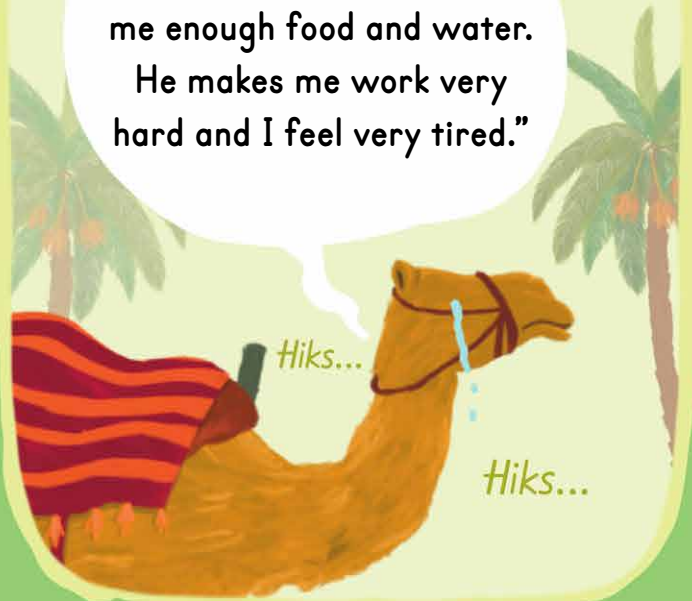
The Prophet صلى الله عليه وسلم Rescues a Camel

"My master does not give me enough food and water. He makes me work very hard and I feel very tired."

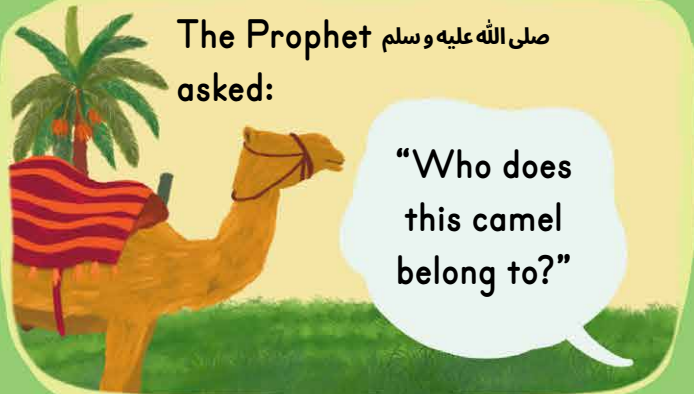


The Prophet صلى الله عليه وسلم stroked the camel's back and ears. So, the camel calmed down and stopped crying.

"Who does this camel belong to?"

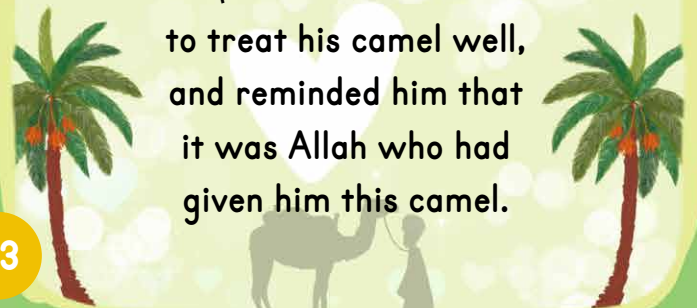


A man came and said:

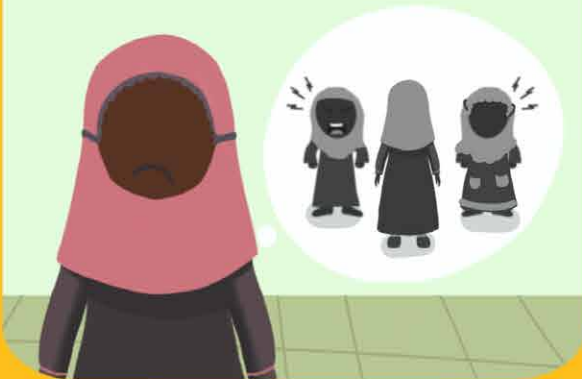

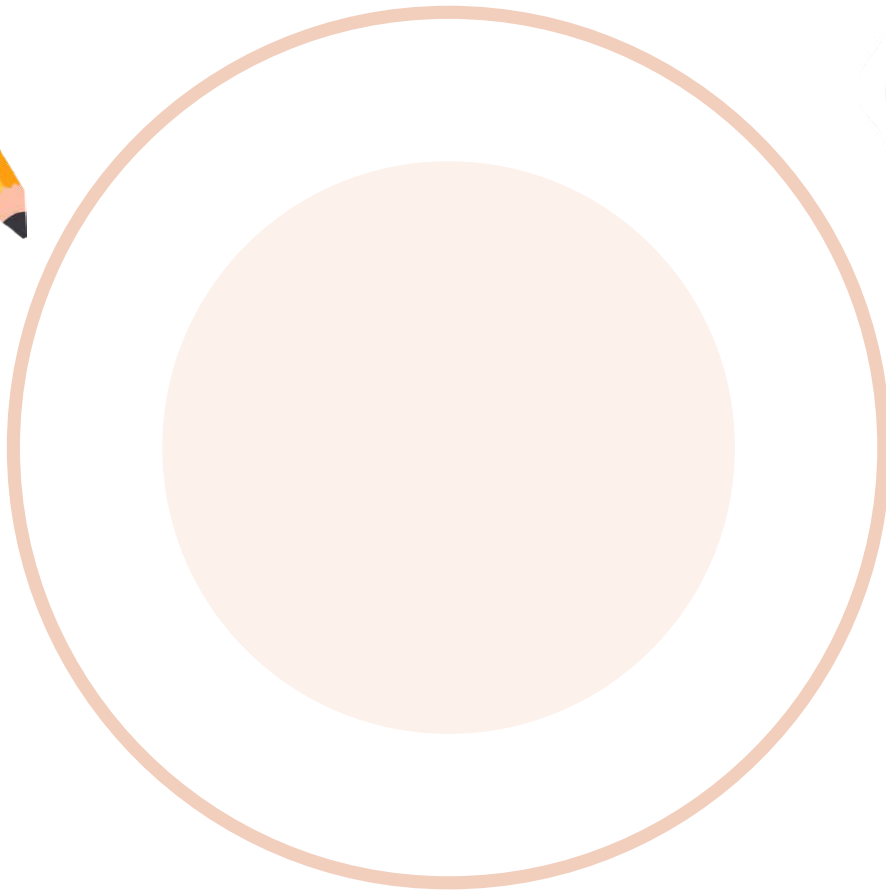

Abu Talhah told his wife what Prophet Muhammad صلى الله عليه وسلم had asked him to do. His wife said that they only had enough food for their children.

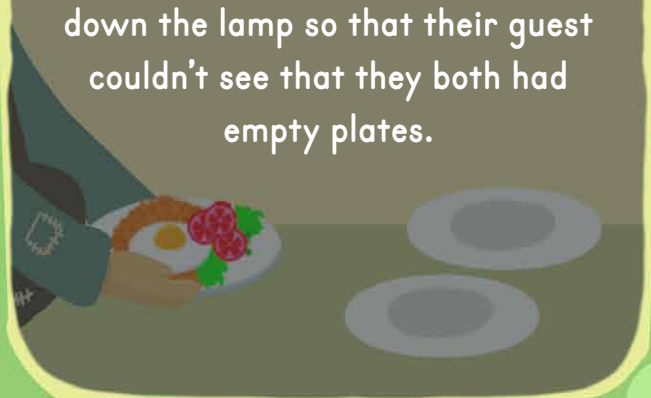


Abu Talhah made a difficult decision and sent his children to bed. A meal was prepared for their guest.



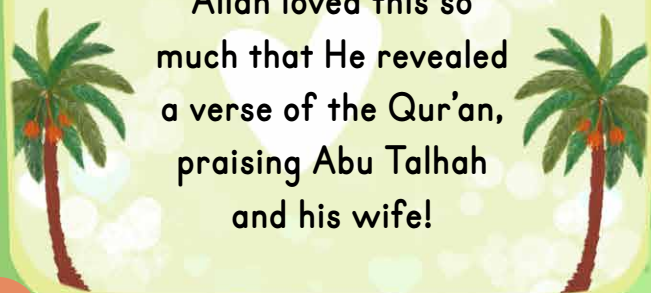
However, it was only enough for the guest.

Allah loved this so much that He revealed a verse of the Qur'an, praising Abu Talhah and his wife!

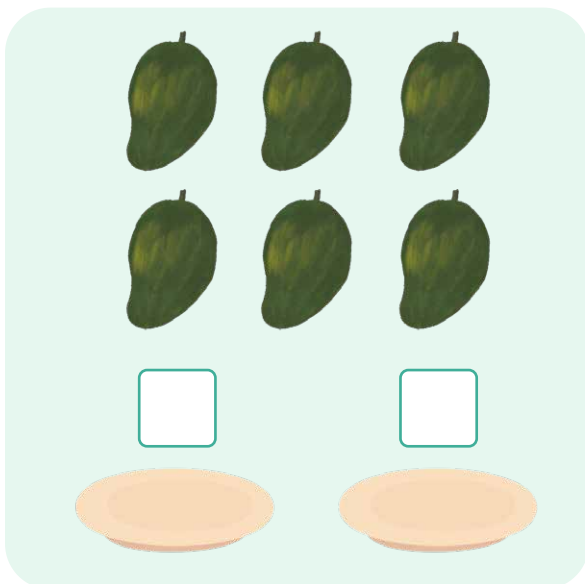
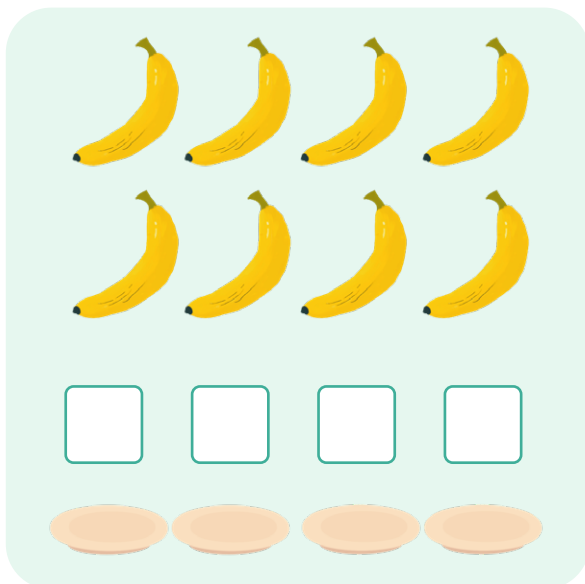
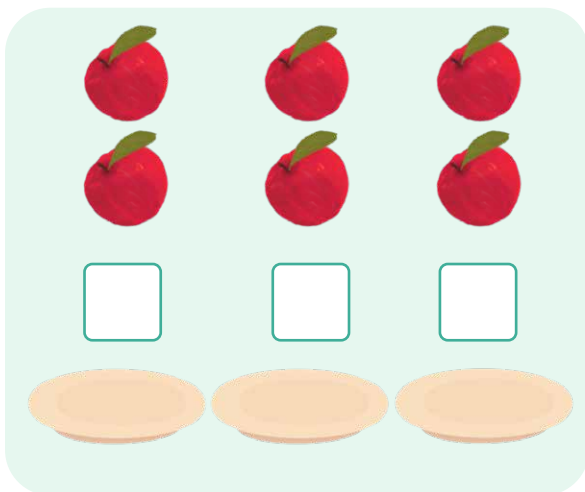
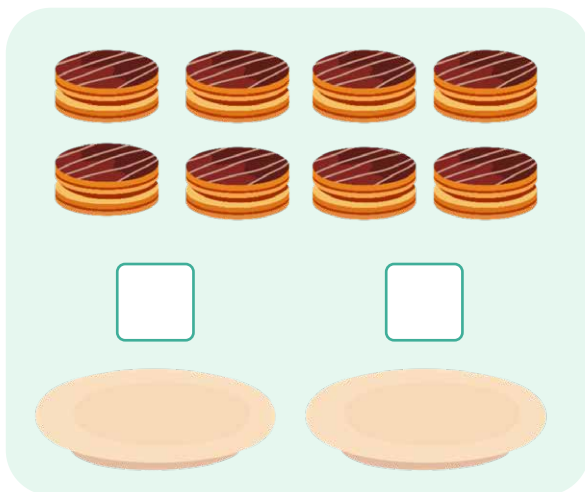

The Sudden Noise

One night, the people of Madinah suddenly woke up because of a sound they heard. They all came out of their homes to check if it was an enemy trying to attack. They suddenly saw the Prophet ﷺ on a horse telling them not to be scared. The Prophet ﷺ had already rode around Madinah and checked if there was an enemy.

Buying a Well for the Muslims

When the Muslims came to Madinah, there was only one well which had clean and sweet water. But it was very expensive for the Muslims to drink from it. The Prophet ﷺ promised a spring in Jannah for whoever bought the well allowing the Muslims to drink from it without having to pay. Uthman رضي الله عنه saw this as a chance to do good, so he quickly bought the expensive well.

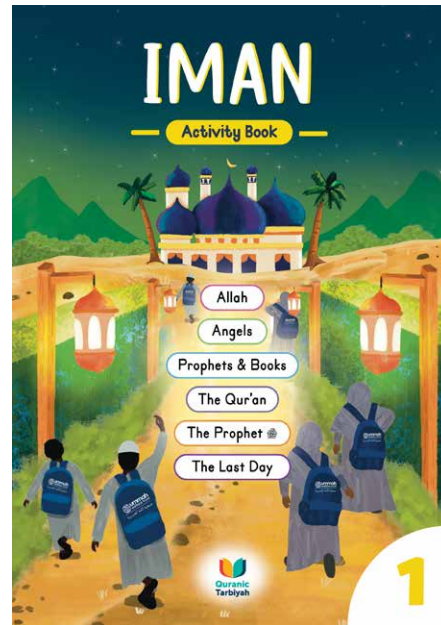
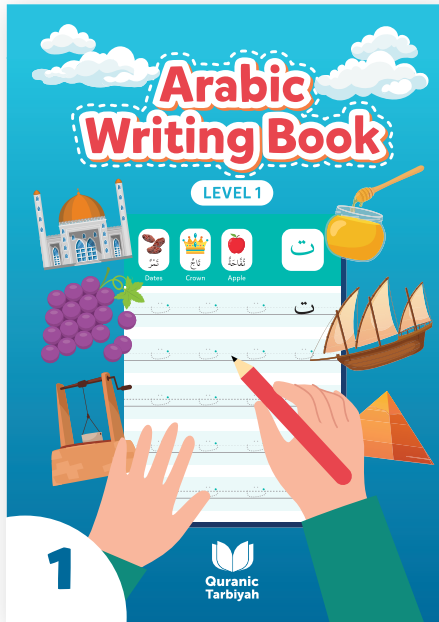
